REMINDER - Get Your House In Order!

The Pennsylvania Supreme Court has dismissed the legal challenges imposed by certain interest groups intent on stopping the casino projects, which means they are likely to move forward quickly. Foxwoods and Sugarhouse casinos could open as early as next year, pending city approval. Foxwoods has announced it is looking for vendors to fill \$65 million of work toward phase 1 of the gaming facility.

“It’s the last legal hurdle dealing with the board’s decisions” Doug Harbach, spokesman for the Gaming Control Board, said of the Supreme Court decision on the Riverwalk suit. (Philadelphia Business Journal, 07.18.2007, 179th year, No.48)
